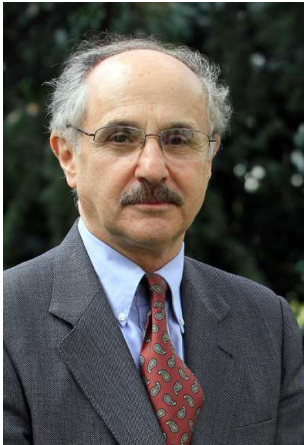


JURY – CLIMATE CHANGE CATEGORY**CHAIR****Prof. Edward S. RUBIN**

Edward S. Rubin is Professor of Engineering and Public Policy at Carnegie Mellon University (Pittsburgh, PA, United States), where he was founding director of the Center for Energy and Environmental Studies. A fellow of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, he is also a past chairman of its Environmental Control Division. His areas of research interest are energy and the environment, technology innovation, and technology-policy interactions, with a particular focus on power generation systems, carbon sequestration, and global climate change. His teaching achievements have been recognized with the Lyman A. Ripperton Environmental Educator Award, and he served on the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2007.

Miquel Canals is Professor of Marine Geology at the University of Barcelona (Spain), where he founded and continues to head the Marine Geosciences Research Group. A former Associate Director of Research at the CEFREM Training and Research Center on the Marine Environment (Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique – University of Perpignan, France), he has served as an expert evaluator for the European Commission and for research funding agencies in Australia, Belgium, Spain, the United States, France, Italy, Norway and the United Kingdom.

He is a member of the Board of the Stockholm Environment Institute (Sweden) and of the Advisory Board of the Grantham Research Institute on Climate Change and the Environment (London School of Economics and Political Science). Among his many honors are the CBE (Commander of the Order of the British Empire) and 2007 German Environment Prize.

Bjorn Stevens is Director of the Max Planck Institute for Meteorology (Hamburg, Germany), where he leads the “Atmosphere in the Earth System” department and the International Max Planck Research School on Earth System Modeling. Professor for Atmospheric Sciences at the University of California in Los Angeles (UCLA) and a professor at the University of Hamburg (Germany), he holds the Clarence Leroy Meisinger Award of the American Meteorological Society (AMS) and from 2002 to 2007 served as editor of the *Journal of Atmospheric Sciences*.
